Each June over 100 children from all 16 Maine counties join forces with over 80 volunteer first responders for a week of exploration, healthy activities, outdoor recreation, and education. Campers adjust to new places and people – all while being mentored and cared for by officers of Maine law enforcement and public safety organizations.

First responders, current and retired, from all 16 counties in Maine spend the week 24/7 at Camp POSTCARD; many have been Camp POSTCARD leaders 10, 20, and even 30 years! Their goal is to give children an experience that will enrich their lives and give them hope for the future. During this week, campers experience officers as caring and fun-loving people primarily concerned with the well-being of children.

Camp POSTCARD gives children a new perspective on what's possible for them to achieve; the adults who are providing these many experiences and cheering them on are officers and many other caring adults. Camp POSTCARD gives children a boost to their confidence; they broaden their horizons and have the world open up to them in ways they could not imagine.
